Chas. H. Butler, who had farmed in the Coquille valley, near Myrtle Point, for half a century, passed away last Sunday after a short illness. Funeral services were held at Schroeder's funeral parlors in Myrtle Point at 2:00 p. m. on Tuesday, Rev. F. H. Barr officiating. Interment was in the Norway cemetery.

Mr. Butler was born in Maine, Aug. 14, 1866, and was nine days past 76 years of age. He came to this section when 20 years of age.

He is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Maude Barklow, of Coquille; Mrs. Evelyn Wilson, of Bend; Mrs. Florence Schneider, of Illaha, and by three sons, Chas. N.
