For one year the proposal might be advantageous, and as Mr. Dunn has previously said in talks on the subject, the bill would be more acceptable if the measure had not been worded to include "all" moneys received from state income tax soruces in excess of \$7,500,000 in any year to be distributed among school districts. Mr. Dunn's statistical article is as

Local school district taxes would be reduced approximately 50 per cent next year if the proposed initiative measure diverting excess state income taxes to school districts becomes law.

The local district would receive about \$28,000.00, which is slightly over half the amount of money raised by special tax in this district.

The proposed initiative measure provides that all income tax receipts in excess of \$7,750,000 be distributed to all school districts in the state according to the number of pupils educated in their respective districts.

The estimated income tax receipts according to a recent announcement from the State Tax Commission is \$14,000,000 for the year 1942.

Sponsors of the measure claim it would provide substantial benefits to education in Oregon and to the local property owners who now bear 98.3 per cent of the cost of their local
