Scherer, manager, Marshfield office of the United States Employment Service; George Jenkins, County Agent of Coos county and Robert Knox, County Agent of Curry County, Ex-

tension Service; Ted Bitsch and Jack Koch, Smith-Hughes Instructors; Glen Weaver, Assistant Supervisor, State Division of Vocational Agriculture and Leonard W. Rice, County RR Supervisor, FSA.
