Bag Limits For Fishermen

Anglers fishing for salmon and steelheads are allowed a daily bag limit of five such fish in the aggregate when over twenty inches in length and a possession limit of ten in all waters open to such fishing except the Columbia River and its tribsame as last year, three in the aggregate of salmon and steelhead over twenty inches in length in any one day and not more than ten in any seven days. The season for salmon and steelhead over twenty inches in length is open the year around except in those waters for which special regulations have been provided.

Jack salmon under twenty inches in length may be taken the year around also and the bag limit is six such fish
