Rationing Notes By The O. W. I.

Meat, cheese, butter and canned fish will be rationed, starting March 29. Red stamps from war ration book two will be used and 16 points have been allotted for each of the first four weeks. Points left over from one week may be added to those of the next week. The grocer will make "change" with one-point stamps. Not rationed are poultry and game, fresh and frozen fish, soft or perishable cheeses, olive oil.

Lost ration books or coupon sheets can be replaced only by applying to local war price and rationing boards. Mutilated books require the same procedure.

Kerosene and fuel oil rationing for non-commercial cooking and lighting has been placed on a six month basis instead of the former three in order to reduce the number of trips consumers must make to their rationing boards.

Fuel oil users who would be entitled to receive extra rations of 100 gallons or more for heating purposes will not be issued such rations if they can obtain the extra heat from coal or wool stoves, says Office of Price Administration. But householders facing serious hardships due to abnormal conditions may now apply at local boards for additional allotments of fuel oil.

Egg ceiling prices will vary with the normal seasonal up-and-down swing of egg prices over the year, according to the fixed markup system established by Office of Price Administration to determine maximum prices.

Peas, beans and lentils bought exclusively for use as seed do not require the surrender of point ration stamps, according to a decision of Office of Price Administration.

New Certification Rulings For Teachers

The office of the county school superintendent is in receipt of new rulings with regard to the certification of teachers. This information is therefore available to teachers who have been out of the teaching profession and who wish to qualify as "emergency teacher." Emergency certification is however restricted by rulings which have been set up and which are too numerous to be set forth in this article.

In order to receive an emergency certification a teacher must have a position waiting for him or her and also have the recommendation of the local school board, as well as having the approval of the county school superintendent. Upon receipt of this information and recommendations, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction is authorized to issue emergency certificates on the basis of the rules and regulations adopted by the State Board of Education.

Commodities For Schools

The office of the Coos County Public Welfare Commission has made the following announcement: "Schools who are undertaking the use of Federal Commodities and which have not prior to March 1 had such services will have to communicate directly through the Portland office. It is provided, however, that the regular warehouse will handle the actual distribution of foodstuffs. The schools which are now receiving federal commodities are as follows: Allegany, Bridge, Bunker Hill, Coaledo, Coos River, Eastside, Englewood, Lakeside, Marshfield District No. 9, Millington, North Bend High School, Riverton and Sunny Hill.
