Items From County
Superintendent Office

Clerks Prepare Budgets
Meetings for the purpose of assisting clerks or others who desire assistance in preparing budgets are being held in five towns in Coos county.

The meetings have been scheduled by County Superintendent Martha E. Mulkey, who will attend all. W. H. Munck, C. P. A., will be present to help clerks, at some and probably all of these meetings.

School boards which are not finding it necessary to vote budgets at the annual school meeting on June 21, will find it much more satisfactory and accurate to postpone budgeting until after the funds are received.

Non High Budget
The meeting of the budget committee for the Non High School District of Coos county will be held at the court house on Wednesday, May 12, at 8:00 p. m. The budget committee members have been chosen in accordance with the local budget law, one from each of the five zones of the Non High School District. These are: W. H. Eickworth, Empire; Ray Buckles, Roy; Mrs. Myrtle Smith, Eastside; Mrs. Elmer Wilson, Sitkum, and Ellis Selander, Millington.

The budget committee will face a very difficult situation because of the rapid increase in the cost of tuition as well as transportation.

The Non High School District will, however, along with the other districts, profit by the funds which will be received as an offset on property tax from the State School Support fund.

Non High Vacancy
A vacancy in the Non High board of directors will this year fall in Zone 3. The candidates for director for this zone will therefore need to come from one or three school districts, Bunker Hill, Millington or Delmar. The candidates, however, are elected by the voters at large in the Non High School districts. Petition forms are available in the office of the county school superintendent.

A. R. Delmar, of the Delmar school district, is now holding the office and has served as a very regular attendant of the Non High school board meetings during the last five years.

Close of Schools
The month of May will bring about the close of practically every school in the county. The Prosper school was the first to close, on April 30. The early closing date was due to the fact that Prosper is one of the two schools in the county which runs less than nine months.

The majority of the schools will close around May 21.
