The 66th annual commencement of the University of Oregon has been set for Sunday, May 30, at McArthur court, according to Dr. James H. Baccalaureate and commencement services will take place the same day, with an estimated 600 seniors graduating. The commencement address will be delivered in the evening by Dr. Donald M. Erb, president of the university, whose topic will be "Wars Also Teach."

A brief inauguration ceremony for President A. L. Strand will be a feature of the seventy-fourth annual commencement at O. S. C. Saturday morning, May 29, at 10 o'clock. Approximately 600 men and women are scheduled to receive their degrees this year. While this is a smaller number than made up last year's record class, it will be one of the largest in the history of the institution.
