How Valuable Is The A. W. S. Service?

How valuable is the Aircraft Warning Service—its ground observer, filter center and information center installations?

Put that question to officials of the Royal Air Force's Fighter Command during the precarious days of 1940's Battle For Britain and you will promptly get a resounding "Swell." Just ask any member of the American Volunteer Group which served with distinction in China and he most likely will give you the same answer with the same degree of positiveness.

The truth is that the Aircraft Warning Service as it is operated in the United States is a system which has been tried and proven in the stern crucible of war.

The British were the first to test its capabilities. There is little difference between their organization and ours. They, too, combine the activities of ground observers, radars, and Filter and Information Centers to provide the fighter command with an accurate "Flight Picture."

Thus, it made no difference that the RAF was outnumbered during the height of the Nazi's savage aerial blows. No matter where the Germans struck, Spitfires, Hurricanes and Beaufighters were always on hand to greet them. Of course, the Germans got through to do some damage, but not without a severe mauling at the hands of the RAF.

Apparently the Germans were not familiar with the extent of Britain's Aircraft Warning Service. They did not know that no matter from what direction they proceeded to bomb England, the Fighter Command controller knew their every move and was able to dispose of his precious fighters accordingly. It is apparent that because of the seeming persistence of the RAF, the German high command overestimated the strength of the British forces.

The whole thing came to a climax in September. The Germans who had previously given up daylight bombing as too costly, were bent on making a shambles of London with night assaults. They lost 187 planes in 24 hours through the efficiency of the RAF interceptions guided of course by the A. W. S. It was then that Hitler decided mass bombings of England too costly.

Britain had succeeded in the fight for her very life, for it is no secret now that invasion of the islands themselves hung in the balance of their desperate defense against Marshal Goering's raiders. It was then that Churchill was moved to remark, "Never have so many owed so much to so few."

In fact, during a recent series of speaking engagements in Portland, Arthur Collins, a financial advisor to public authorities in London, England, said, "There is no finer job that an old-timer from the last war can do than this work in the Aircraft Warning Service. Our Royal Observer Corps accomplished a mission that played great part in inspiring the Prime Minister's new famous remark. I had the distinct privilege of serving in the Royal Observer Corps throughout the Battle For Britain and the blitzing of London. And, gentlemen, any of you who have smelled the smoke of battle can appreciate with me, the grand feeling it gives one to be a part of the action. There is no finer service you could give to your boys over there, than to assure them that you are doing your part over here. May I urge you to think deeply whether or not you can play a part in this great service."

In China and Burma it was much the same with then Col. Claire L. Chennault's A. V. G. With the help of the Chinese, one of the most remarkable warning systems the war has seen was devised. It is said to have been so good that the A. V. G. knew the strength and objectives of the Japanese raiders before they left their bases.

The sum and substance of the foregoing is that the Aircraft Warning Service is an integral part of a fighter command. With it, one fighter plane is worth sixteen, according to the U. S. Army Air Force's own reckoning.

Furthermore, the United States is fortunate to have obtained the service of hundreds of civilian volunteers in the Aircraft Warning Service. If it were not for them, the Army would be forced to use soldiers in every single position manned today by a volunteer. This would amount to ten infantry divisions—on the Pacific Coast alone.
