Rationing Calendar

(Clip and keep for handy reference) Ration Book No. 2

October 2—Expiration date of red stamps X, Y and Z, last of the red stamps series in War Ration Book 2. X becomes valid August 22; Y on August 29, and Z on September 5.

September 20—Expiration date of blue stamps R, S and T (processed foods). Blue stamps U, V and W become valid September 1, good through October 20.

Ration Book No. 3 (Brown stamps) Replacement book containing coupons to be used as those in ration book 2 run out.

October 2 — Expiration date of brown stamps A and B. October 30 — Expiration date of brown stamps C, D, E, and F. A becomes valid September 12; B on September 19; C on September 26; D on October 3; E on October 10; and F on October 17. Each weekly series good for 16 points.

Ration Book No. 1 Sugar. October 31 — Expiration date stamp No. 14, five pounds. Canning sugar stamps No. 15 and 16, each good for five pounds, through October 31.

Shoes. October 31—Stamp No. 18, good for one pair of shoes, expires. Fuel Oil

September 30—Period 1 coupons in new fuel oil ration valid through January 3, 1944. One unit, period 5 coupons valid through September 30 for 10 gallons. Ten unit, period 5 coupons, valid through September 30 for 100 gallons. Coupons with gallonage printed on the face valid for amount indicated until expiration date shown on coupon sheet.

Gasoline September 21—Expiration date for No. 7 stamps in A book, each good for 4 gallons.

Tires Cars with C ration books must have tires inspected every three months; B books every four months; A books every six months. September 30 next inspection deadline for A book holders. Commercial motor vehicles—tire inspection every six months or every 5,000 miles, whichever occurs first.

Centennial Displays In Coquille Windows

facial hirsute decorations and the name of Schroeder is quite prominent in the names of those shown. There are river scenes, logging scenes, with the old-time bull team in evidence, the old Washington school building here, pictures of her parents and other old times scenes and buildings, contributed by Mrs. Ida Owen, and here again it is worth anyone's time to stop and have a look.

In the Lorenz Department Store window are shown a blue and white counterpane made by Mrs. M. O. Hawkins' grandmother more than 100 years ago and another counterpane made by Mrs. E. E. Leslie's great grandmother. There is also a collection of old-time glassware from Mrs. Hawkins and an old Well-Fargo duplicating press which Henry Lorenz used when he was the express company representative here.

In Miss May's Shop window a woman's figure is clad in an old full dress gown owned by Mrs. F. L. Groggough. It was made in England and was shown at the Crystal Palace in London in 1843, before being secured by Mrs. Groggough's grandfather for her grandmother and brought to the United States. A small stand, owned by Mrs. J. S. Barton, belonged to Mr. Barton's mother and was brought to Oregon from Virginia in 1850. On the stand is an old-fashioned lamp belonging to Mrs. Pearl-Ellingsen and a creamer and sugar of Mrs. C. A. Barton's.

In the Excel Dress Shoppe window is an old spinning wheel brought to Oregon in the covered wagon days; Mrs. A. J. Sherwood's wedding dress, first worn Dec. 9, 1885; a Bible printed in 1879 and a lady's black basque of the last century, all belonging to Mrs. Hawkins; a shawl and brooch over 100 years old, a petticoat made in 1888 and a pair of fashionable lady's shoes worn in 1899, all contributed by Mrs. Inez Chase. Also a pioneer, woven-bottom chair owned by Mrs. R. A. Wernich.

In the Hallock Dress Shop there is an old-time clock, 150 years old, loaned by the Biegger Furniture Co., a parasol, high shoes and pin cushion which came from England which belong to Mrs. Ellingsen; the wedding dress worn by Mrs. Martha Mulkey's mother; a small swivel picture of Mrs. McMitchell's grandmother and grandmother, the picture being 100 years old; a Bible of Grandma Mitchell's printed more than 100 years ago; and an up-to-date baby buggy of the period when Mrs. McMitchell rode in one.

While the displays are not as large as it was hoped would be shown for this Centennial exhibition week, they are all interesting and much more could be written about the history of each.

Lum and Abner At Liberty This Week

Lum and Abner in their latest starring film, "Two Weeks to Live," prove why they are listed as radio's top funmaking team, attracting a daily audience of many millions.
