Mrs. Beach Was Bear Creek Pioneer

(Western World)

The death recently of Mrs. Rosella Beach was the passing of one identified with the early history of the Bear Creek valley, one of the most productive agricultural areas in Coos county. Mrs. Beach had a clear memory despite her advanced age, and shortly before her death had begun telling early experiences with a view of perhaps having them recorded. The following concerning her family and others was told to Mr. and Mrs. Haga: John Flam and family came to Bear Creek in 1872 from Minnesota near Minneapolis. They came to San Francisco by train and to Empire by ocean steamer and up Coos Bay to Isthmus Slough by boat, from where they came overland on the wooden railroad track with wagons drawn by mules, to Beaver Slough, now Coaledo.

From Beaver Slough they came down the Coquille River by scow to Bear Creek, now Parkersburg, where they met Dr. S. L. Leneve, their first friend in the new country. They then went up Bear Creek on an elk trail, packing their belonging on their backs. The Bobble Rock place, now the Devereaux ranch, was the first place they came to. Others, in their order were: the Evans place, now the W. J. Haga farm; Jenkins, now the Heffley place; Van Leuven, Bingaman, Benson, (now the Frank Culver place) Flam; Baldwin (now the Morris Ray place), Doyl, and Randleman on Randleman creek.

The Prewett family came to Bear Creek in 1873 or 1874. The Flam girls were the only girls there when they arrived.

Rosella Flam was married to Horace Van Leuven in 1874. They were the first couple to be married on Bear Creek. Horace Van Leuven died in 1883, leaving her with five children, the oldest ten years old, and the youngest five months. She raised the family on the home place—the Van Leuven place. She later remarried and her name was Mrs. W. L. Beach when she died.

John Flam, father of Mrs. Beach, left Germany in 1857 when Mrs. Beach was two years old. Her father was the first man on Bear Creek to have a cow and a team of oxen. Her husband, Horace Van Leuven, was the first one on Bear Creek to own a horse. She was remarried in a shake house as there were no other kind of houses then. At the time of her death she had been making her home with Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Fellows on Bear Creek. She was 88 years of age.

Youths Of 17 May Now Enlist in Navy

Enlistment of qualified seventeen-year-old young men for future Naval flight training has been resumed, and applications now are being received by the Naval Aviation Cadet Selection Board, Seattle.

The program, which calls for college training before the enlistees begin their flight instructions, has been reopened with quotas considerably smaller than those prior to the closing down of enlistments July 1. Only high school graduates not later than who will be graduated not later than February 15, 1944 are eligible. Young men who have not been graduated can be enlisted now and will be placed on an inactive duty status until they receive their high school diplomas. Following their graduation from high school, these young men will be sent to college at Navy expense and will receive up to one year of college training. Those who have completed their high school probably will be sent to college in the near future.

The program following college includes: four months at a Flight Preparatory School, three months at a CAA-WTS School, where they receive their first flight training; then three months at a Pre-flight School, and then approximately seven months at Naval Air Stations. Upon completion of this the young men will be commissioned as Ensigns in the Navy or Second Lieutenants in the Marine Corps, and will receive the golden wings of Naval Aviators.

But the training does not cease here. The young men are sent on to operational bases—for two more months of specialized training, including Navigational flight, formation flying, gunnery, and all other phases of combat aviation.

In order to qualify, a candidate must rank in the upper fifty percent of the male members of his high school class scholastically and must have recommendations as to his moral character and general reputation. Parents' consent is necessary for any young man to be enrolled in this program.
