Canning In Oven Is Not Safe

The incident in Coquille of the explosion of six jars of chicken while canning in the oven, should serve as a warning to other home canners to eliminate this method of home food preservation. Fortunately no one was hurt, although the oven was considerably damaged.

"This is just one of the reasons why oven canning is never recommended by the Oregon State College Extension Service," says Mrs. Dorothy E. Bishop, county Home Demonstration Agent, their local representative. Exact temperature control and an understanding of canning techniques is necessary for home canning. Oven-canning, at any time a slow and unsatisfactory way of applying heat necessary to can food safely, has developed wartime hazards, according to Mrs. Bishop.

Thermostats are not always accurate, homemakers may fill their jars too full, put the lids on too tightly, or use commercial jars (mayonnaise, etc) not tested for home canning, with the consequent result of jar explosion. Then, too, the contact of the room temperature air with the hot jar when the oven is opened may also cause jar explosion.

Although other methods have been used with a certain degree of satisfaction to the homemaker, the use of the pressure canner for all non-acid vegetables, meat, fish, and poultry, and the hot-pack, hot-water bath method are the only recommended methods for 100 per cent safety.
