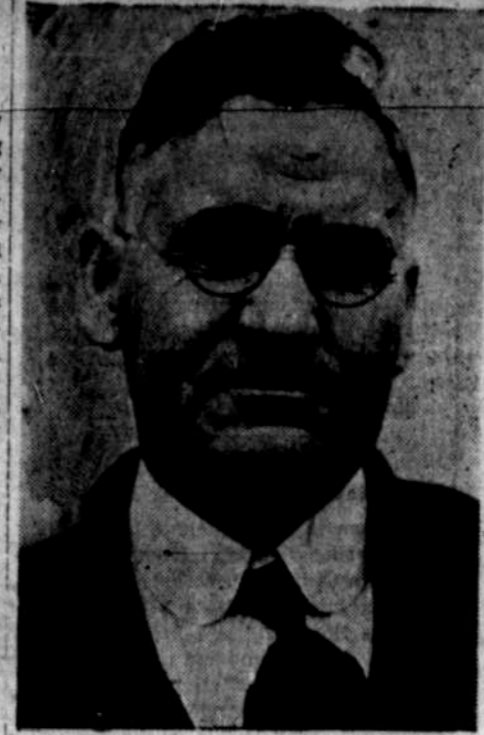
Probate Court Items
