"I received a letter from Ray Woodyard the other day. He said the States were sure getting tough. It must be pretty well changed. By the way if you see old Bill Fortier, tell him 'hello,' for me. Also tell him I would sure enjoy one of his good Acme beers. Also hello to George Johnson."

#### Letter Tells Of Alvin Shaver's Death May 23

Mrs. Geo. D. Potter, now residing in Pasco, Wash., sends a copy of the letter from Lieut.-Com. Paul C. Williams, commanding officer of the unit to which her son, Alvin Shaver, belonged when he was killed last May 24 in a plane crash in Alaska. He was buried May 25, with full military honors.

Alvin, who left Coquille several years ago, was a graduate of Coquille High School, a most likeable young man, and one who was very popular with all who knew him.

Mrs. Potter writes that she found it impossible to reply to all the letters she had received from friends in Coquille and she transmits Lieut.-Com. Williams' letter for the information of inquiring friends. It was written in June and reads:

"At a time like this words are so inadequate so may I quote a passage of scripture read by the Chaplain:

"I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith."

Alvin's loss to the squadron is keenly felt by all of us and our thoughts are with you at this time. He gave his life attempting a take-off when enemy forces were believed to be near. His courage, devotion to duty and example he set were in the highest traditions of the Naval Service.

Protestant services were conducted and he was laid to rest with full military honors on a hill overlooking the broad Pacific. Everything that was done was with the thought as to what you would like and I believe you would have approved. Interment was made in a Naval Cemetery at a base where this squadron was operating. I wish I could give you the exact location at this time but I believe you will be advised in the very near future.

**Julia says—  
Coffee can be entertaining**

IT'S ONE THING to brew a pot of coffee and it's another to use coffee as the principal theme in feeding and entertaining a group of people.

I'm thinking of such problems as: taking care of a group of Red Cross workers, or the war-working woman who wants to entertain some friends of a Sunday morning, or an informal midday meeting of P. T. A. members.

Recently I took another trip down into the heart of that hospitable state, Texas. And I had the warm pleasure of being a guest at just such a "party." The hours were from eleven in the morning till half-past twelve.

When I investigated the details later (my curiosity is never satisfied) I discovered that the whole thing had been contrived simply and in a short time. The menu was as follows:

- Baked Chicken Hash with Ripe Olive Sauce
- Broiled Tomato Halves
- Hot Corn Muffins Currant Jelly
- Coffee Cake and Coffee

The coffee cake tasted so good with the coffee, I asked my hostess for the recipe. Here it is:

- 1 1/2 cups enriched flour
- 1 egg
- 3/4 cup milk
- 1/2 tsp. soda
- 4 tbsps. melted shortening
- 1/2 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 cup seedless raisins
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 cup sugar

Sift flour, measure; sift again with soda, baking powder, cinnamon and sugar. Beat eggs well; add milk, shortening and raisins; then flour mixture and mix until thoroughly combined. Pour into well-greased square baking pan (8x8x2) and let stand in warm place 10 minutes. Sprinkle with topping made by combining 2 tablespoons flour, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 tablespoon butter. Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 25 minutes or until done. Serve hot. Serves 6 to 8.
