Coos county winner in the National 4-H Club Safety Activity Contest is Hazel Nelson of the Sunnyside School. Her report has been submitted to Harry Seymour, State 4-H Club leader, Corvallis, for competition in the state finals, according to Mrs. Dorothy E. Bishop, Coos county home demonstration agent.

Each contestant was to survey the farm home and out-buildings, working conditions, driving conditions and school conditions. They were to list twelve hazards, correct them, and write a story of their accomplishments. Reports from the various members who entered the contest in-

dicates that several accidents have already been prevented.

A Warning To Landlords In This Area

The following bulletin was received by your local War Price and Rationing Board in answer to the numerous rent complaints received: "According to the President's decree of October, 1942, rent ceilings were established throughout the country, but only in certain areas known as defense-rental areas is there at the present time federal machinery for enforcement," stated Daniel D. Gage, District Executive.

"When a county or city permits its housing rents to rise sharply, federal machinery may be installed without notice, which action rolls back rents to March 1, 1942 levels. Many cities and counties in Oregon are operating with a voluntary Fair Rent Committee in an effort to comply with the above Presidential decree. It is possible for a small group of landlords to bring federal rent control enforcement into their community by their action in totally ignoring the directive to maintain the March 1, 1942, levels."
