Mrs. Perry O. Hansen will appear at the Methodist church on Monday, November 1, with a dynamic message direct from the fields of China. It has been said of Mrs. Perry, that she is one of the most dynamic speakers brought to the Oregon churches for a long time.

The meeting will begin promptly at 7:30 o'clock Monday evening. The public is invited to attend. No charges are being made, only a free-will offering will be received.

This is an opportunity to hear at first hand of the situation in China.

To Hold Prayer Service For Missionaries, Prisoners of War

A special prayer service for the health and safety of their missionaries, held as prisoners of war, will be conducted at the Coquille Seventh-day Adventist church on Saturday, October 30. While this is a special day of prayer for interned missionaries, we also have sons who are prisoners of war, for whom we pray daily, which should be included at this time," said Pastor H. D. Strevver.

Eighty-nine adults and twenty-seven children—members of Adventist missionary families and parts of families left in fields afar when the war broke—are still interned in Germany, India, Japan, North Borneo, China and the Philippines, Mr. Strevver said when announcing this special service. Among these, he said, there are mission directors, physicians, nurses, evangelists, teachers and secretaries.

Reports thus far indicate that three of those restrained in China may possibly be repatriated and returned on the MS "Gripsholm," now on her second trip. They are Rev. B. L. Anderson, Amoy; Dr. C. L. Dales, Shanghai, and Mrs. D. D. Coffin, Canton.

Pastor Strevver says that the service here is part of a world-wide prayer program that will be carried out in all Adventist churches this week. A growing anxiety and feeling of concern for the safety and welfare of their missionaries has prompted the Executive Committee of the General Conference at Washington, D. C., to recommend the devoting of the day appointed for special prayer in their behalf.

"Let everyone pray daily that victory may soon be gained by our armies and our boys returned home," says Pastor Strevver.
