Only One Traffic Fatality During Recent War Games

Secretary of State Bob Farrell today disclosed that only one traffic fatality involving a civilian driver and military personnel occurred in the central Oregon army maneuver area during the recent war games, just completed.

With approximately 70,000 men involved, and with thousands of military vehicles added to the normal traffic stream over highways and streets in this area, Farrell said the record was good.

"Civilian drivers in Oregon are to be congratulated on their spirit of cooperation with army authorities in avoiding traffic accidents in the maneuver area," Farrell declared. "Accidents involving military personnel constitute tragic interference with the army training program in this state. It is fortunate indeed, that civilian drivers understood this danger and drove accordingly."

While the intensive maneuvers are over for this year, the Oregon secretary of state reminded drivers that there are smaller maneuvers in various parts of the state in connection with the army training program. He urged drivers to observe regulations when driving in the vicinity of army camps, particularly with regard to the 35 mile wartime speed limit.

Christmas Seals On Sale Here Soon

Christmas seal sale of the Coos County Tuberculosis Association is being handled in Coquille by Mrs. B. G. McBride, chairman for the city, with the Coquille Junior Women's club acting as sponsoring group, according to Mrs. U. E. Richter of Marshfield, Coos county chairman of the seal sale. Seals will be mailed to individuals by Nov. 22, according to Mrs. Richter, with five dollar bonds available through Mrs. McBride for business firms or individuals wishing to support work of the tuberculosis association and unable to use the stamps.

Ninety-five per cent of the funds received from the sale remain in the state to further the work in fighting this disease, the other five per cent going to the national organization for use in research work being done on tuberculosis. Special emphasis is being given to the 1943 sale to help prevent the rise in number of cases of tuberculosis that occur during a war.
