B. W. Dunn To Attend Former Coquille Conference In Seattle

Burton W. Dunn, local school superintendent, has been highly honored by receiving an invitation to participate in the American Association of School Administrators' conference which is being held in Seattle, Washington, January 10, 11, and 12.

"The People's Schools in War and Peace" is the theme around which the speeches and discussions will center at this important wartime conference on education.

An outstanding feature of the program will be President Worth McClure's report of his observations in Great Britain. His recent tour of that country was made at the request of the U. S. Office of War Information and the British Ministry of Information.

Mrs. Dorothy E. Dunn, wife of Superintendent Dunn, will accompany him on the trip to Seattle.

Opportunity For Boys In Naval Aviation

A five-fold boost in quotas for naval aviation cadets has increased opportunities for many more young men to obtain the U. S. Navy's famed \$27,000 aviation education, today reported the Portland office of Naval Officer Procurement.

Naval flight training is now open to 18-year-old high school as well as 17-year-old boys, provided they are currently enrolled in high school in their last semester or are high school graduates. Eighteen-year-olds apply to the U. S. Navy first and if qualified they may volunteer through selective service for induction.

Applications may be made in this area by mail or in person to the Portland branch, Office of Naval Officer Procurement, 330 American Bank building, Portland. Boys being given serious consideration will have their travel paid to Portland and home again so that they can be interviewed, given physical examinations and aptitude tests.

Ina Bell Fox Died Unexpectedly

Ina Bell Fox died unexpectedly at her home, 1138 No. Eastside St., Olympia, Wash., Tuesday night at the age of 70 years. She had been a resident of Olympia for 18 years, going there from Centralia. She was born at Quessy, Indiana, came west with her family and married John J. Fox at Coquille, Oregon, in 1900. She was a member of the Adventist Church.

She is survived by her husband, John J.; two sons, H. C. Fox, of Port Angeles, and O. B. Fox, of Tacoma; one daughter, Mrs. Hazel Swenson, of Seattle; three brothers, Clark Hull, Tom and William Hull, all of Coquille, Oregon, and by three grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held in Mills & Mills chapel Saturday, January 8, at 3:00 p. m. The Rev. E. M. Oberg will officiate.

Boys accepted probably will not be sent to school before four months.

Any young man who is not found acceptable does not go into any other branch of the navy unless he desires to enlist. Cadets enlisted before they finish high school must graduate before they can go on active duty.

Cadets receive eight months training at a college handling the navy's C-11 program, followed by 15 months flight training. After completing this they are commissioned ensigns in the United States Naval reserve.
