Coos Oil Prospect By California Geologist

The Sentinel is in receipt of a letter from a geologist, Wm. L. Walden, who lives in Reseda, Calif., which seems to have been inspired by John Ewell's statement that there is probably a larger oil field underlying Oregon than there is under southern California. This writer never heard of Mr. Walden before but presents his letter for what it is worth to those interested in oil and gas development in Coos county:

Reading oil items is always interesting to me, and to also contribute something along that line is a pleasure to me.

As we read the very favorable reports for the discovery of new oil territory in the Coquille locality, we readily wish it a success. As our conditions now stand, the United States has, to quite an extent, opened the oil floodgates to aid the supply of the world, and we will have to face the music. This is what the boys tell about one of their officers when our Army was over in Cuba. The officer was not liked very well and was just leaving on an "absent" leave. The band struck up "I Don't Care If You Never Come Back." The officer quickly replied, "I can face the music."

John F. Ewell must have had in mind a supply of major quantity when he said that there is more oil in Oregon than California. Even at that, there might be to quite an extent more than one side to the proposition; of the first possibly a laugh, and the writer living in Reseda, California, some twenty years, is supposed to be a Native Son, and conditions would be equaling the sky as the limit before acknowledging any superior to the Golden State of Sunny California. But as we are now being educated in freedom of thought and speech by the late International advertisement of the Bill of Rights, I will venture to say as to my surveys in the West, the State of Washington has many oil fields to be discovered that would equal the extent of oil territory in the Kettleman Hills field; but this I will say in favor of Oregon, and let's proceed with a survey that isn't so much of a guess.

In section 28 Township 26-S, Range 13 W, Coos County, Oregon, you have equipment for drilling many thousands of feet, with mechanical power and speed, and generally speaking, the deeper depths produce the gushers. This locality has in its favor silt-edge indications. In my geographical survey, if oil is discovered, it will represent not one field, but separate oil pools. In 1935-1936 I made surveys in Oregon and Washington.

Let's now take in contrast the discovery of oil in the state of California, which was some 67 years ago, northwest of Los Angeles in Los Angeles county, discovered by California Star Oil Co., which now bears the distinction of being called the grandfather of the Standard Oil Co. Of course, Grandfather, with all of our recent years of progress, reflects a thought of goodnight. Quite true. This field is called Pico Oil Field and if I understand the working conditions there, it was drilled by weight power of two men, to a depth of 350 ft., producing a yield of 25 barrels a day; but it was a starter and as I have indicated, if the present drilling in Section 28 by the Phillips Petroleum Corporation proves successful as a start with improved mechanical equipment, they can speed the development of an oil field.
