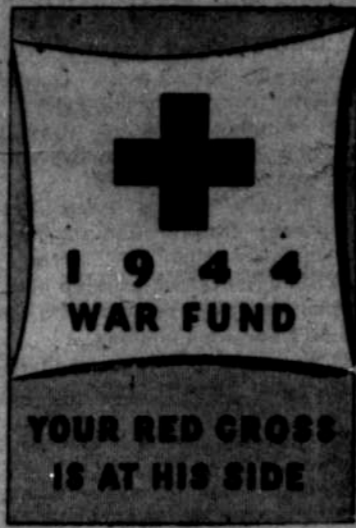

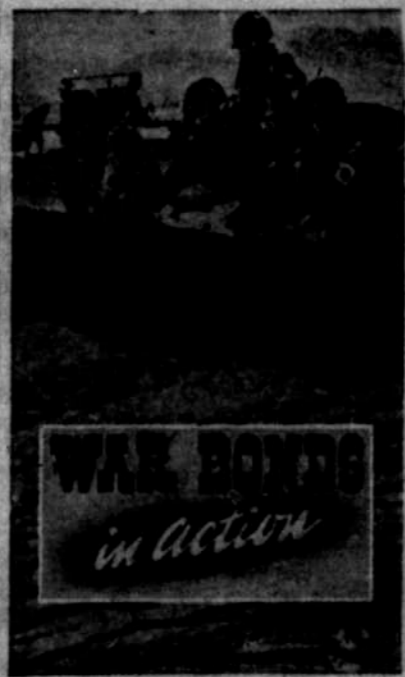


12-Year Old Merlin Spencer Died Here Last Thursday
