Farmers To Inspect Nursery At Lee

Farmers of Coos county who will have seeding to do this year will have an opportunity to observe plots of a large number of grasses and clovers at a field meeting which will be held at the County Forage Crop Nursery at the Hardy Mast farm in Lee Valley on Wednesday, May 10, at 1:30 p. m., according to George Jenkins, county agricultural agent.

E. R. Jackman, extension specialist in farm crops at Oregon State College, will be present to discuss the production of forage crops and other questions which may be presented. A. N. Bodtger, Farmer Fieldman for the Agricultural Conservation Program, will outline practices through which assistance will be rendered to those who have seeding to do this year.

The County Forage Crop Nursery was seeded a number of years ago by the County Agricultural Agent, with the co-operation of the Coos County Court and the Oregon Experiment Station. It includes 40 different one-acre plantings of various grasses and clovers and mixtures of them. The meeting next Wednesday will provide an opportunity for those who attend to view these plantings and determine which of the various crops included are giving best results under hill land conditions and all persons interested in this subject invited to attend, Mr. Jenkins stated.
