Coos Fell Down in April War Bond Purchases

Coos county sold 79.1 per cent of its April quota of war bonds, it is announced by Clarence Coe, Coos county war finance committee chair-centage of 150.3 per cent represents sales of \$123,872.

Champion bond seller in the state was Wheeler county, whose high percentage of 150.3 per cent represents April sales of \$15,026.

The state as a whole invested \$8,901,430 in war bonds, it was revealed by E. C. Summons, state chairman, Oregon war finance committee, which is 96.8 per cent of the April quota of \$9,200,000, which is also established as the May quota.

Oregon Was Second In 1943 In Lowest Pedestrian Fatalities

Oregon, the second safest state in the nation in 1943, so far as pedestrians were concerned, has recorded a 28 per cent reduction in pedestrian fatalities so far this year, according to Secretary of State Bob Farrell. Seventeen pedestrians have been killed in traffic this year, compared to 23 for the same period a year ago.

For the year 1943, Oregon won second place in the national Pedestrian Protection contest, sponsored by the American Automobile Association, the state of Wisconsin winning first place.
