Mamie Rebekah Lodge met in regular session in the I. O. O. F. Hall on Tuesday evening, when routine business was attended to.

It was announced that this lodge has been awarded the Honor Roll Certificate of the Association of Rebekah Assemblies, and is also on the Honor Roll of the Rebekah Assembly of Oregon. This certificate is given each year to Rebekah lodges showing an increase of two per cent or better in their enrollment, with no loss of membership through non-payment of dues. Out of the 193 Rebekah lodges in the state, just 35 such certificates were awarded.

The ladies who put on the Junior-Senior banquet for the High school reported that in all respects it was highly successful.

Two new members, Mary F. Elligson and Margaret Wolgamott, were elected and degree team practice was planned in order that they may be given the degree at the next meeting.

Plans for the annual District Convention which is to take place in Marshfield in July were made. Mrs. Myrtle Benham was selected to take part in the quiz contest on lodge work. A tentative count was made of those who expect to attend the banquet at that time. Mrs. Ruth Beyers was appointed Coquille's press representative for the convention.

Reports from the state convention, the Rebekah Assembly of Oregon were made by the delegates, Mrs. Myrtle Benham and Mrs. Harriet Schaefer. Mrs. Benham, who will be District Deputy President next year, gave the main report. On the first evening of the Assembly she, in company with 158 others, received the Degree of Chivalry for which she had been recommended by the lodge. The next day, Tuesday, May 16, the annual Assembly proper began and continued for two days, with its usual ceremonies and business. Roll call on Wednesday morning showed 315 delegates present. Of particular interest to Coquille valley people was the election of Marion Wilson of Bandon to the office of Vice President. In the Grand Lodge of the I. O. O. F., which was going on at the same time, Fred Schaefer was appointed Grand Herald, and the Ladies Auxiliary of the Patriarchs Militant chose Viola Spencer as president for the coming year, with Gertrude Spencer as right aide.

Two things commented on by both ladies were the very beautiful and impressive initiatory work presented and the greeting of many former Coquille citizens, including Miss Edith Gruenewald, Mr. and Mrs. Hal Harless and Mrs. Evelyn Oerding. Mrs. Anna Morrison was reported as being ill. Mrs. Inez Chase thanked the ladies of the Sewing Club for the Past Noble Grand's pin they awarded her at the Mother's Day dinner.
