School Buses To Be Inspected This Summer

Inspection of the 700 school buses operating in Oregon is to be made during the coming summer school vacation with a view to providing the greatest degree of safety for their young passengers, and for determining where new buses may be allocated to replace units of equipment found to be obsolete, says a communication from Public Utilities Commissioner Geo. H. Flagg.

The department of education is said to be sponsoring the investigation, and the state police department will be asked to conduct the study, beginning with the close of the current school term.

On the report to be made by the state police will hinge the granting of operating permits for buses to be used during the school year beginning next September. It is pointed out that the Oregon law requires that the operators of school buses, as well as of all other motor vehicles pass an inspection and secure the approval of the state police before the commissioner may issue operating permits.

He flew to Portland from San Francisco and has reservations for return flight to San Pedro, where he is assigned to a ship. He wears the Asiatic Pacific bar, Defense bar and Good Conduct bar. He went through battles in the Coral Sea, the Solomons and Guadalcanal. Jack states he lost three months getting his rating because he failed to receive a reply from the High school here for his request for mathematics credits.

Bibbie Terrell, first class machinist mate, who enlisted in the Navy seven years ago, is now in school at Norfolk, Va. Following the twelve weeks course he will emerge a chief machinist. His boat is nearing completion in San Francisco now. For the past twenty-seven months, he was on a boat out of Lima, Peru. From there he returned to Portland, Maine, on a Coast Guard cutter, coming to San Francisco by train and north by bus to visit his parents in Portland.
