Canning To Be Demonstrated June 28

Of considerable interest to the homemakers of Coquille will be the announcement of a Public Canning demonstration to be held at the Liberty Theatre, Wednesday, June 28, under the sponsorship of the Coos County Nutrition Committee and the Oregon State College Extension Service.

The demonstration, patterned after pre-war cooking schools, will be conducted by Mrs. Vivian Freeman, who has been a canning specialist of the Research and Educational Department of the Kerr Glass Manufacturing Company for the past ten years. Mrs. Freeman will be remembered by many Coquille homemakers, having made an appearance before an audience of 450 at the Roxy Theatre in 1940.

This demonstration should prove valuable to both beginners and experienced canners. Mrs. Freeman will demonstrate safe and reliable sealing methods for all types of jars now on the market. She will show the most efficient ways to use pressure cooker and hot water bath methods of canning fruit and vegetables and will explain the proper use of the wartime rubber sealing rings and three-piece glass closures with which homemakers have had so much difficulty. "The use of exactly the right seal for the individual type of jar you are using is of utmost importance if your winter's food supply is to be kept from spoiling," Mrs. Freeman says. She further points out that just because a cover can be screwed on a jar does not mean that it will fit that jar well enough to seal.

Mrs. Freeman will also pass on the newest developments and scientific procedures on how to keep berries from floating, how to can corn, peas, and beans, and how to keep tomato fruit in the jar from turning dark. She has promised to demonstrate the new and easier way to can large, light-colored fruits to give better appearance and how to make them taste sweeter with less sugar.

Because it is of vital interest to all homemakers to "Waste not—Can a lot" in order to make the nation's food supply cover all the demands, homemakers can do much toward keeping food spoilage at a minimum. Persons who experienced any type of food spoilage last year are invited to bring with them to the meeting any jar or jars of food on which they would like to have any suggestions for improvement.

Realizing that many homemakers who do lots of canning are working during the daytime, the committee has agreed to arrange a night meeting with Mrs. Freeman should a sufficient number request it. Persons interested in such an arrangement should call 65L and leave their name.
