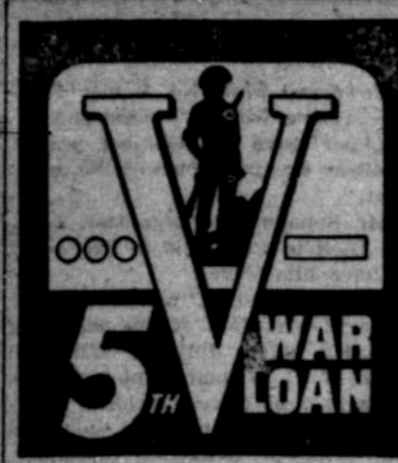

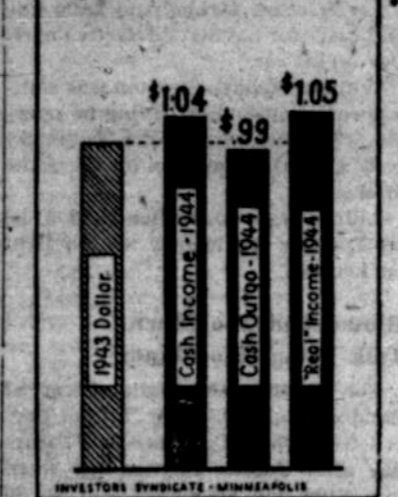

**American Income Rises 5 Cents; Living Costs Off One Cent from 1943**

**PURCHASING POWER April 1943 vs April 1944**



THE above chart, showing how the average American fared in national income changes in the last twelve months is based on the monthly consumers' study of Investors Syndicate of Minneapolis. The American public in April had a "real income" of \$1.05, or an increase of five cents on the dollar over the same 1943 month. This "real income" is not a subtraction of cash income and expenditures but an average relative of these figures designed to show how living costs affect adjusted income dollars. Cash income of the American public in April was \$1.04 for every \$1 a year earlier. This gain of four cents on the dollar resulted from the following changes per dollar: wages up four cents, salaries three cents and other income up four cents on the dollar. Investment income at \$1.05 was up five cents. Rents in April were unchanged compared with a year ago. Clothing was up four cents. Food was down five cents. Miscellaneous items were up four cents.
