A new index, covering a library of diversified technical research, production, marketing and management problems, is now available to small manufacturers in this area, it is announced by George R. Moscrip, district manager of the Smaller War Plants Corporation in Portland. The index lists several problems that have already been solved through the Technical Advisory Service of the Smaller War Plants Corporation. They embrace 58 different fields, including automotive, ceramics, chemicals, metals, pharmaceuticals, plastics, radio, rubber, textiles and wood. The complete library is available for reference purposes in the Smaller War Plants Corporation Regional office, Seattle, Washington.

Mr. Moscrip, in his announcement, urged all small manufacturers with any type of production problem whatsoever, or in need of research assistance, to contact the Smaller War Plants Corporation District Office, located at 608 Bedell Building, Portland, Oregon. In stressing the importance of this relatively new service, Mr. Moscrip said "Technical Advisory Service" is something small business men have been waiting for a long time. For years the Department of Agriculture has been providing advice and aid to farmers, and now SWPC, through its Technical Advisory Service, is offering a long-felt need to the small manufacturer in much the same way.

Sweden Will Be One Of Oregon's Best Post-War Customers

Oregon will be one of the chief buying markets for Swedish imports in the post-war area with greatly increased shipments of fresh apples, pears, also canned fruits, dried and evaporated fruits being shipped by the all water route, according to advices of W. R. Grace & Co., general agents on the Pacific Coast. A fleet of modern, fast motorships of the Johnson Line will be placed in operation just as soon as the war in Europe is over, advices received here from Stockholm announce. Sweden once more will become one of this State's best customers. This country in 1938 exported \$64,227,940 worth of goods to Sweden and in turn imported \$45,066,899 from that country.
