**Rotary Governor To Visit Here**



William D. Shannon

The Rotary Club of Coquille will welcome on Aug. 9, William D. Shannon, Governor of the 101st District of Rotary International, which includes 95 clubs in Oregon, Washington, Idaho, British Columbia and Alaska. Mr. Shannon is a consulting civil engineer in Seattle, Washington, and is a member of the Seattle Club. He was nominated as Governor at the Victoria Conference held last April and was formally elected at the 1944 Convention of Rotary International in Chicago, Illinois, in May.

Mr. Shannon will visit the Rotary Club of Coquille to advise and assist President Jess Barton, Secretary Hode Caughell and other officers of the club on matters pertaining to club administration and Rotary Service activities. He is one of the 140 Governors of Rotary International who are supervising the activities of 5,200 Rotary Clubs with a quarter of a million members in more than 50 countries throughout the world.

Despite the war, this world-wide service organization continues to grow in numbers and in strength. Since July 1, 1943, 150 new Rotary Clubs have been organized.
