How The Plan Works In Hawaii

The Coquille Townsend Club submits a letter received from the Townsend headquarters in Hawaii showing what the \$80 at 60 years plan has done over there to reduce taxes. That plan is similar to the measure which will appear on the Oregon ballot this fall, for adoption or rejection, and as the Townsend correspondent says, "See what the Little Townsend Plan will do for us at 60. Try and beat it!"

Our Gross Income Tax has produced so much money that we are compelled to cut the tax rate, 16 2/3 per cent. At times like this when more and more money is needed, this may be "something new under the sun" and as you know our rate was only 1 1/2 per cent . . . now it will be 1 1/4 per cent. We have a surplus of several million dollars. Do you know any state with a tax rate so low as ours that can cut their rate because they have too much money? Our law is flexible and when too large a surplus accumulates, our Governor is compelled to reduce the rate. This is the second time the Governor has been forced to reduce the rate because of too large a surplus which proves the Gross Income to be a super, super tax.
No more practical endorsement of the Gross Income Tax is possible.

Army Horses Brought Good Prices at Myrtle Point Last Week

A crowd of several hundred people was present for the sale of government riding and cavalry horses at the Fair grounds in Myrtle Point, Tuesday afternoon, and bidding was somewhat better than had been expected, all of the 44 horses offered being sold in about two hours. Al Lapan, of Roseburg, acted as auctioneer.

The horses auctioned here had been in use by the army and coast guard for beach patrol work, for the past two years or more, and came from Hauser, Bandon and Marshfield mostly. They were fairly well blooded, geldings, their ages ranging between seven and 14 years and all seemed thoroughly broken and in good condition.

Prices paid for the animals ranged from \$67.50 to \$197.50, with an average for the 44 sold of \$113.29.

So far as could be learned, most of the successful bidders were from the Coquille valley, and fair and horse show officials are anticipating a marked increase in the number of horses entered in the horse show here next month in connection with the Fair—Myrtle Point Herald.
