companion, Bobby Burns, is quoted as saying, "It was good French, easily understood by French people." In her second group were two numbers, one by Richard Strauss, "Dream in the Twilight," and the other by Franz Schubert, "Impatience." These two were rendered in German which, of course, adds full advantage to the composition without loss contained in translation.

As Miss Skeels started singing "The Lord's Prayer," the light went on inside the suspended cross above the organ and choir loft. The number was outstanding and so impressive that several seconds elapsed before there was applause. Probably there was no greater contributing factor to the success of the concert than the ability of the accompanist, Mrs. M. O. Hawkins. She is the artist's ideal in that she never runs off with the music but lends herself to the singer always and gives over to the artist's interpretation.

Again in the third group, the effect was augmented when in "Ave Maria," the piano accompaniment led a mild sustained background very delicately executed by Bobby Burns on the organ. Two beautiful numbers followed in the same group with the organ accompaniment only.

The organ group offered by Bobby Burns assisting with the program demonstrated his ability as a talented musician. Strains of the violin which are not in the organ seemed to pour out at the touch of the player in "Caprice Viennois," a violin number by Fritz Kreisler. This he accomplishes and works out synthetically through his own originality and resourcefulness. His third number, "Selections from Carmen," which is rousing and boisterous, was grand. As an encore he played the old familiar hymn, "Near the Cross," using the effect of oblique, vibra harp and marimba.

Miss Skeels' interest in young talent led her to include an opportunity on her program to hear Ronald Williams, student violinist under Mrs. Muriel Dae Ardath. It is amazing to see the progress already made; he has arrived at a certain point of artistry and has a lovely interpretation. He was received with emphatic applause. His encore, "The Bee," was skillful. It will be remembered that in the concert held here five years ago, Miss Skeels included Audrey Aasen, at that time also a student of Mrs. Ardath. Miss Aasen is now a successful teacher in the Bay area.
