Unemployment Compensation For War Veterans To Begin Sunday, September 10

With returning veterans eligible for unemployment allowances beginning the week of September 10-16, the State Unemployment Compensation Commission is preparing to take claims in 22 local employment offices. The Commission has signed an agreement with the Veterans Administration for administering the unemployment provisions of the GI Bill of Rights.

Men and women who have served in the armed forces 90 days, at least one day of which must have been after September 16, 1940, may draw up to \$20 a week for 52 weeks if they can not find suitable work. Maximum benefits go to veterans who have served at least 10½ months. Duration provisions do not apply to those discharged by reason of injury or disability in line of duty.

Unemployed veterans in remote areas should write to the nearest employment office for instructions concerning the sending in of claims by mail. With only a few thousand Oregon service men and women now discharged and with war jobs still plentiful, officials do not expect an influx of claims until reconversion gets under way.
