17-Year Olds May Now Enlist In The Coast Guard

Enlistment in the United States Coast Guard Reserve will be opened October 1 to seventeen-year-old men, after having been closed since February, Lieut. (j. g.) L. A. Murray, Thirteenth Naval District Personnel Procurement Officer, announces.

Recruits will receive their basic training at Alameda, Calif., and then be sent either to an advanced training school, where they will receive training which will fit them for advancement in civilian life or be assigned to duty afloat.

The enlistment quota for this district, which includes Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and Wyoming, is 70 men. Oregon men may apply for enlistment at 806 S. W. Morrison Street; Portland, Lieuten-

ant Murray said.

Only men actually 17 years of age, who are physically and otherwise qualified, will be accepted: Those who have reached their eighteenth birthday must enter military service through Selective Service.

Little Respect Shown For The 35-Mile An Hour Rate

Eighty-five per cent of the drivers using the Pacific highway during the month of August traveled at speeds up to 48 miles an hour, according to Secretary of State Bob Farrell. Speed checks maintained by the traffic engineering division of the state highway department showed that the speed of the majority of drivers was slightly under the rate set for July.

Only 15 per cent of the drivers held their speeds under 35 miles an

hour, the wartime speed limit, compared to 17 per cent during the month of July.
