What we want to know is whether the Forestry Service should dictate to the game commission just as to when the deer season should open, or that in spite of this opposition that a sensible season be declared concerning the killing of deer?

The way the open season is now on deer and elk, if a hunter wants to get himself a good piece of meat he had better hie himself off to some slough in pursuit of bull frogs, as they are about the only meat that is prime during open season—that is if you happen to be fond of frog legs.

The season is being advanced a notch at a time until the first thing we know we will be hunting deer 'round Christmas time.

Fact of the matter, many of the season on both game and fish could undergo a change for the benefit of the sportsmen and especially the deer and elk seasons. We are wondering why the army officials, as

well as Forestry officials, have stuck their noses into game affairs in such a persistent manner? It is the business of the Forestry Service to keep on the lookout for and to cure forest fires after they have been started, but we fail to see why such preventative measures should be taken as wishing to keep the sportsmen from the woods during really good hunting conditions and when the meat is good, in order to humor said officials.

Sportsmen start very few fires—a real woodsman never starts one. But to be downright frank on the subject we are of the opinion that if more fires were started, such as the ones that burned over a large area in the Charleston district and in different parts of the coast country the past summer, that everyone concerned would be better off. It lessens the fire hazards, clears the ground for grazing and in many instances eliminates real fire hazards entirely.

The past season is the only season for years that burning was encouraged by Forestry officials and permits issued when things would really burn and the results were more than satisfactory as any official of the service will inform you, I am sure.

Every hunter isn't a firebug. A hunter does not wish to burn down the refuge, the cover of the game which he pursues, and yet if it happens to be a dry season when the law opens at any reasonable date as it used to in past years, a cry goes up from timber owners, the Forestry Service and a lot of the public asking that the Governor issue a proclamation closing the season.

The sportsmen at large would think a lot more of the game commission members if they would bow their necks and open the season at a reasonable time of the year, regardless of what the opposition has to offer.

The season should open on buck deer in the month of August—the first of August—and close the last of September. That would make an ideal season. In addition to that, it would give a hunter a chance to camp out without encountering cold, rainy, disagreeable weather and when he shot his buck he would bring home meat fit for human consumption instead of a barrel-necked, musky-smelling buck that should have never been killed. And that's that!

### Free Advice On Baby Care Available, Demonstration Office

Brief, practical, and straight-to-the-point advice on baby care from the beginning of the pre-natal period until the child has reached his fifth birthday is now available through a correspondence course on "The Home With a Small Child."

The course is a series of timely letters that are sent out by the Coos County Home Demonstration Agent and is especially designed for new

mothers. Seven letters are sent during the pre-natal period, four during the baby's first year, and one on each of his birthdays until he reaches five years of age.

The project is in no way a substitute for a physician's or nurse's care but rather to supplement it. The information included in the letters was contributed by Lucy A. Case, Nutrition Specialist, Lucy Lane, Clothing Specialist, and Lois Lutz, Home Management and Home Furnishings Specialist, all of the Extension Staff at Oregon State College, Corvallis.

Mothers desiring to register for the course should send for an enrollment card from Mrs. Dorothy

Dunn, Home Demonstration Agent, Court House, Coquille. There is no charge nor obligation for enrolling in the course.
