In 1943 Ickes created six Indian ervations in Alaska, including one of 1,400,000 acres for 33 aborigines in he Chandalar district. Right now, one of his Bureaus is considered three petitions to give to not more than 1200 Indians exclusive rights to the uplands, tidelands, and salt and fresh water of millions of acres in Southeastern Alaska. At least four other similar petitions have been filed covering other parts of Southeastern Alaska. If granted, and the threat is plain that these reservations will be created, white labor and capital will be shut out from use of the fish, minerals, timber, waters, and other resources of all of Southeastern Alaska, and Alaska itself will have no power to raise taxes therein for its government. Once lekes gives Southeastern Alaska back to the Indians, nothing can stop him from returning all of Alaska to the Eskimos and Indians. Indian reservations will give control to Ickes over the Indians. The Indians are too simple to understand that Ickes will rule them with an iron hand. But, control means political power. *Ickes wants power?

Will Ickes keep his job if Dewey is elected? No! but, if FDR is reelected Ickes will have Alaska under his thumb. Dewey's election alone can save Alaska. We urge, we plead, we beg you to vote for Dewey and Bricker on November 7th and to save Alaska from Ickes and bureaucracy.
