The second forum of the Institute of International Understanding, sponsored by the Rotary Club of Coquille, will be held in the High School Auditorium at eight o'clock next Tuesday evening, November 7. Ticket at 50c are available at the High School and at the city hall.



Hubert Phillips

Hubert Phillips, Professor of Social Science at the Fresno State College, California, will be the principal speaker. His subject will be "Russia's Position—East and West." Dr. Phillips will also talk to the students of the Coquille school Tuesday afternoon.

This will be the second of the series of four Institute programs presented by the Rotary Club as a service to the community. The other two programs are scheduled for November 28 and December 5.

Hubert Phillips was born in Ohio and was educated at the University of Chattanooga and Columbia University, receiving the Ph. D. degree from the latter institution.

He has traveled quite extensively abroad, having been on the staff of the American People's College, Oetz, Austria, in 1932 and 1936. In 1937 he was on the staff of the Poncono Study Tours in Japan and served in the same capacity with the Open Road in Europe in the summer of 1938.

Phillips has been a contributor to the Nation and The Survey Graphic. He has spoken before audiences in all parts of California. He has appeared before the Commonwealth club of San Francisco ten times.

At the present time Phillips is Professor of Social Science at the Fresno State College, is a member of the State Commission on Immigration and Housing and is also member of a national panel of arbitrators of the American Arbitration Association. He was formerly president of the California Conference of Social Work.
