In just four days the citizens of the United States of America will exercise their right to vote at the polls, to elect a president of this grand country. The right to vote as we please is one thing that has not been curbed by the O.P.A. As you cast your ballot, it behooves you to stop and ponder, to gaze ahead and not behind. "Remember Pearl Harbor" when you cast that ballot, for the sneak attack pulled there by the Japs could have been avoided by a wide-awake administration, by placing officers in charge there who were not asleep on the job. Had that attack been foiled, as it should have been, Japan would never have gotten the badge on us that they did during the early months of the war—the war would have been shortened and thousands of our brave lads' lives saved.

Remember that it was under the present administration that millions of tons of scrap iron were sold the Japs when the administration knew beyond the shadow of a doubt that it would soon be shot back at us. But they did not wish to offend Tojo. Remember that it took a war, a war in which hundreds of thousands of the youth of our land have died, in order to give every person a job—a job in which they are filling their pockets with "blood money"—money gained at the expense of the cost of the youth of America.

Remember the broken promises of the man in the White House today, when you cast that ballot. Remember the authority exerted by him in dictating to the Attorney General of the United States as to how the Montgomery Ward case of Chicago should be handled. Remember that he had Mr. Avery tossed from his office because he stood up for his constitutional rights as a citizen but that nothing was done about it when he was defied by the head of a labor union. Remember that he is spending money faster today than the people of America are making it. Remember that Eleanor was allowed to cavort over the entire U. S. and many parts of the western hemisphere, burning hundreds of gallons of gas while the average American citizen was deprived, or curbed to the extreme, in its use.

Remember the ban put on coffee, on various commodities that were not necessary.

Remember that Harold Ickes is Roosevelt's right hand man and that Harold Ickes travelled about the Northwest lecturing upon the return of the Japs to the Pacific coast and asking that they be returned. He must have received encouragement from a high source, for after all, he is naught but a henchman of the New Deal crowd. Urges Voters To Support School Constitutional Amendment

Oregon can climb out of the cellar and pull itself to the level of other states in the field of public education by adopting a constitutional amendment to provide state support of public schools, Dr. Frank W. Parr, executive secretary of the Oregon State Teachers' Association, declared this week in a speaking tour of the state. He revealed that Oregon ranked next to the bottom among the 48 states in state support of schools and declared the only way in which it can move out of that position permanently is to make state support a part of the constitution.

He declared that adequate state support must be "put beyond the reach of pressure groups who would tamper with the state's basic school system," and said the amendment, which will appear on the ballot next week, is the only way in which permanent support can be guaranteed.

Dr. Parr reviewed the record of state support during the last two years, provided from surplus income tax revenues. He declared the temporary support has relieved local property owners of much of their burden and argued that such relief must be made permanent. He lashed out at opponents who have attempted to link the amendment with tax measures on the ballot and reiterated that the manner of raising and distributing funds is left entirely to the state legislature.

This amendment, he said, merely makes permanent what the people of Oregon have already shown themselves to favor, equal distribution of school costs and increased educational opportunity.
