curred when a Pirate was so jostled that the ball flew from his arms and was caught by Jim Kimsey, who ran away from the field, from about Marshfield's 40-yard line, and scored without a hand being laid upon him. The Red Devils then bucked it over for the extra point, making it 13-6, and the crowd began to feel better, as did also Spike Leslie.

The last touchdown came late in the game. Dave Kline, who had been out for more than a quarter after a leg bruise in the first quarter, made a 30-yard run around end, and followed that with another 10 or 15 yard run for the third touchdown. The extra point was made and the game ended shortly thereafter with the Devils winning their fifth straight game, 20-6.

There were at least a thousand spectators at the game and except for the Marshfield adherents, the crowd cheered wildly at this exhibition of power and deception which the Red Devils showed.

The band, the baton twirlers and the majorette gave a very entertain-

ing 15 minutes of music and marching between halves and did themselves proud.

Technical Sergeant John H. Shull, 32, of (NSA), Coquille, Oregon, has been awarded the Good Conduct Medal, it has been announced by the Fifteenth Army Air Force.

In the words of the citation which accompanied the award, Sgt. Shull's work has "demonstrated fidelity through faithful and exact performance of duty, efficiency through capacity to produce desired results. It also mentions that his "behavior has been such as to deserve emulation."

Sgt. Shull is stationed in Italy with a 15th AAF Liberator bombardment group. He is a member of a veteran group which has completed over 100 missions against strategic targets in the network of German industrial, rail and oil centers throughout southern Europe and the Balkans.

Serving as an airplane mechanic specialist, Sgt. Shull entered the service September 5, 1942. He at-

tended the air force airplane mechanics school at Keesler Field, Miss., and the B-24 Factory School at Willow Run, Mich. He was formerly a shipyard construction worker prior to entering the service.

Gary Cooper In "Casanova Brown" At Roxy Thur.-Sat.

Starring Gary Cooper and Teresa Wright, "Casanova Brown," was built primarily for laughs.

Gary Cooper's role is that of Casanova Brown, a literary professor, who, on the eve of his marriage to Madge Ferris learns that he is the father of a child born to Isabel Drury (Teresa Wright) after her parents had had his previous marriage to her annulled.

When he learns that Isabel is offering the child for adoption, he takes the baby from a maternity hospital and hurries to a cheap Chicago hotel. Fearing apprehension and the possibility of having the baby taken away from him, he seeks to make his position more secure by providing the baby with a mother, and proposes marriage to the chambermaid, Monica. She accepts and they visit the Marriage License Bureau.

The climax comes when he is traced to the hotel and confronted by Madge and Isabel and their parents, to say nothing of Monica. From this apparently hopeless situation he manages to extricate himself in a

hilarious sequence of events.

The comedy highlights occur when Casanova's cigarette is the cause of the destruction of his parents-in-law mansion, the scenes in the maternity hospital and in the hotel room where Casanova wrestles with the problems of formulas, diapers, and baby burps.

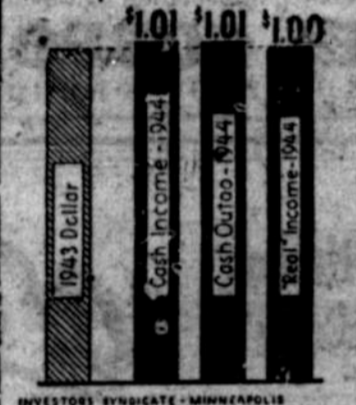

Frank Morgan has a characteristic role as Mrs. Ferris, with Isabel Elsom as his domineering wife. Anita Louise is Madge Ferris, the girl who nearly marries Casanova. Isabel's parents are respectively played by Patricia Collinge and Edmund Breon. Mary Treen is Monica, the chambermaid.

Nunnally Johnson produced and wrote the screenplay, while Sam Wood, credited with seven Academy Award nominations, directed. American Income Rises One Cent; Living Costs Also Up Cent Over 1943

PURCHASING POWER JULY 1943 vs JULY 1944



THE above chart, showing how the average American fared in national income changes in the last twelve months, is based on the monthly consumers' study of Investors Syndicate of Minneapolis.

The American public in July had a "real income" of \$1.00, or the same as in July, 1943. This "real income" is not a subtraction of cash income and expenditures but an average relative of these figures designed to show how living costs affect adjusted income dollars.

Cash income of the American public in July was \$1.01 for every \$1 a year earlier. This gain of one cent on the dollar resulted from the following changes per dollar: wages off 2 cents, salaries off one cent, on the \$1.00; other income up seven cents on the dollar and investment income at \$1.05 was up eight cents.

Rents in July were unchanged compared with a year ago. Clothing was up four cents. Food was down one cent. Miscellaneous items were up three cents.
