He said his group would be sent out on some special assignment in the course of their schooling, which would require from three weeks to three months. He expects to have a short leave granted him upon his return to shore after this training period but is not too sure about it, as he said, "There is a war on."

Before leaving Seattle, he enjoyed the great privilege of having dinner and spending an evening with D. D. Dale and Mr. Dale's daughter, former residents of this city. Mr. Dale is with the Boeing Aircraft plant in that city. He saw the little grandson, Burle Bean, Jr., and reports he is a grand little guy of four months, weighing fifteen pounds. The father of the little man, Lt. Burle Bean, was injured when serving with our armed forces during the recent invasion of France. He had been in a hospital in England for some time, was improving very satisfactorily and, at the time of Grant's visit to the Dale home, the Lieutenant was then on his way home to Seattle for an indefinite furlough. He had never seen his little son, and his wife, the former LaVelle Dale, was impatiently waiting to show him his fine little son.
