W. Hughes, County Farm Security Administration Su-pervisor, Room 14, Bank Building, Superintendent.

Coquillie. A flexible farm lease form, devel-oped by the department of agricul-ture, is offered by PSA as a basis upon which landlords may work out a detailed, written agreement to fit their needs. The form provides for the traditional responsibilities of landlords and tenants, and in addi-tion has special suggestions to en-

tion has special suggestions to en-courage improvements by the tenant and arbitration of disputes between andlord and tenant.

landlord and tenant. FSA services for tenure improve-ments are open to any farmers or landlords in the county who wish help in working out satisfactory rental agreements that will help the tenant, safeguard the landlord's innt, safeguard the landiord's an-ment and guard the fertility of land. Frequent changes of ten-tend to run down the land with essive cash cropping, and provide 1:30 to 5:00 p. m. the land. Frequent changes of ten-

abts tend to run down the land with excessive cash cropping, and provide little assurance of maintaining build-ings and farm improvements. Present tenure problems in the county are reflected by a recent sur-vey which indicates thirty per cent of the farmers in Cops and Curry the tarmers in Lops and Curry counties are tenants and about one out of three move every year. Long leases on a written basis encourage a tenant family to become part of the community, keep the farm in repair, and plan crops, livestock and rotaions that will ke and plan crops, livestock and rota-tions that will keep up the soil. It was brought out that frequent moves are costly to both the landlord and tenant and disrupt community life.
