County Treasurer Chas. Stauff remitted the past week, from last month's huge tax collections, to districts and municipalities in Coos county, the sum of \$592,432.75. A considerable percentage of the collection remains in the county's several funds, but this nearly six hundred thousand was all disbursed within the county.

The schools of the county received \$354,570.11, the cities \$184,391.49, the Port districts \$44,657.40, and drainage districts, \$8,813.75.
