Letter From Vic L. Anglin Written in Europe

Following are portions of a letter written by Vic L. Anglin, who is in the Navy and wrote from somewhere in Europe, to his parents here, Rev. and Mrs. W. V. Anglin of the Church of the Nazarene:

Life here is much the same as always. We are working hard working up a party for the orphans and children of the workers here. The sailors have already given up into the thousands in money and they are giving part of their rationed candy, gum, nuts, etc. Many are giving their time off which is very little, which, of course, makes the gift of greater value.

The base also feeds the children that have not enough to eat. They give them a ration of soup each day. It seems strange in a way to see the sailors doing way over their share, and then remember how the people (including me) back home used to gripe when asked to give a single quarter. The Pearl Harbor war bond drive will probably hit the \$100,000,000 mark soon, and that is all cash sales. We are doing our part, I guess, at least what we are able to do.

I've been trying to find you some suitable souvenirs for Christmas, but they are very difficult to get. . . at least the good ones. They do have a little needle work in town that mom would like. . . handwork, but some of that isn't very good either.

Last I heard from Tom Moyer he was writing from a fox hole in the Solomons about a year ago.

I'm studying Italian and getting along pretty well. I can make myself understood pretty well. My vocabulary is, of course, limited but I'm getting pretty good with my hands. I don't think these Italians could make themselves understood at all if they didn't have hands.
