### Cpl. Donald Chase With Veteran Liberator Group in Italy

Cpl. Donald L. Chase, 23-year old engineer-gunner, has been assigned to a veteran Liberator bomber group stationed in Italy, according to a recent announcement from his unit's headquarters over there.

Cpl. Chase, who is the son of Mrs. Gena Chase of North Collier St., Coquille, entered the Army March 12, 1942, and received his wings July 4, 1944, at Los Vegas, Nev.

His B-24 bomber group has been in combat against the enemy for the past year, and has flown more than 150 combat missions over such major Nazi targets as Munich, Germany; Bad-Voslau, Austria; Ploesti, Roumania, and Blechhammer, Germany. Personnel of the group recently was authorized to wear the Distinguished Unit Badge.

### 'Dangerous Journey' At Liberty Theatre Friday, Sat., Sun.

Sights that will stun your imagination! Weird and wonderful rites in lands full of peril, magic and fascination! "Dangerous Journey," the 20th Century-Fox release that opens Friday for three days at the Liberty Theatre, is a "cumeramazing" caravan to the far-flung outposts of adventure.

The Hindu torture rites, incredibly painful ceremonies in which needles, three feet long, tipped with silver are driven deep into the flesh of the penitent; the River of Death, where the living and dead mingle in murky waters; and the thrilling and unbelievable battle between a handful of unarmed men and a herd of huge, stampeding elephants.

The Deniss-Roosevelt Expedition's travel methods were most unorthodox. They willingly switched from auto to elephant, to riverboat, and from riverboat to painfully slow mountain climbing that enabled them to translate to film what is undoubtedly the weirdest, most thrilling spectacle ever seen by human eyes—the incredible worship of the King Cobra by a wilderness goddess in the remote fastnesses of the Burmese jungles. Only when her tribe was in danger of extinction because no male children were being born, would the Snake Goddess perform the "fertility ritual."

The scenes showing how the slim unarmed woman lures the giant serpent out into the open and, after missing horrible death by only the merest measure of magic, kisses him three times on the head, will leave you limp and breathless. It is a shocking climax to this "Dangerous Journey."

An administrative program to offset the efforts of Great Britain for control of trade in Europe is being studied and it is expected that definite proposals will be made in President Roosevelt's messages to congress. These are reported to be repeal of the Johnson act prohibiting credits to countries which have not repaid their first world war loans, increase of the lending power of the export-import bank and an arrangement to wipe the slate clean of all lend-lease obligations incurred in this war. Repeal of the Johnson act is regarded as a must in legislation to aid in rebuilding world trade, as is an increase in the lending power of the export-import bank. As for lend-lease obligations, aside from a tentative announcement by Russia that her account will be paid in cash over an extended period, no hope is held by anyone in authority that aid given other countries under lend-lease will ever be repaid in any substantial amount. The more pessimistic observers in the national capital have even ventured the opinion that the United States will be fortunate if it escapes being classed as a debtor when the claims of Great Britain and some other nations are presented.

Consumers in the United States will continue their use of California olive oil and such substitutes as may be available for a considerable time yet. No olive oil will be received from the liberated parts of Italy until damage done by the Germans has been repaired. All the Italian processing plants were systematically destroyed by the retreating Germans and only the small presses in Italian homes are now being operated. They produce no more olive oil than is required for domestic use.
