Dr. Millar To Speak Four Days In Coos Co.

Coos county citizens, who are interested in developing post-war democratic way of life will be interested to learn of the return visit of Dr. James Millar to Coos county on January 23, 24, 25, and 26, under the auspices of the Oregon State College Extension Service.
Dr. Millar is a very forceful speaker with enough Irish wit added to his talks to make them entertaining as well as educational. He was born in Ireland and received his early education there. He holds a master's degree from Colorado State and a doctor's degree from Denver. He has done graduate work at Chicago University, Cambridge, and Oxford University in England.
Just prior to the war he visited ten countries in Europe and the Orient. He was for nine years professor at the College of Idaho, lectured summers for the Extension Service of Idaho, was Executive Secretary for the National Board of Education of Presbyterian Church in the Northwest. He is also a member of the Oregon Council of Child Welfare and serves on the National Educational Association Committees.

Extension Course To Be Offered At Coos Bay
A symposium class will convene Monday, Jan. 8, in the Marshfield High school in Room 106. The beginning hour for the first lesson is 7:15 p. m. However at this first meeting the question of the beginning hour will be discussed.
Some very capable people have been selected to act as instructors for the course. These instructors with the subjects are as follows:
Dr. L. S. Bee, "Human Relations."
Dean Buena Maris, "The Family."
Acting Dean H. S. Hoyman, "Personal Hygiene."
Dr. R. R. Huestis, "Reproduction."
Dr. Adolph Weinzirt, "Venereal Infections."
Several of these instructors are well known to the people of Coos county. The order is at present undetermined other than that Doctor Weinzirt will conduct the first lesson. Doctor H. E. Stevens, who will be present at the first meeting, will help with the organization. This course will be different from any which has been previously offered in Coos county in that it is symposium in type, each week being a different instructor. Also the classes will be held on both Monday and Tuesday for five consecutive weeks. After the close of the ten lessons, examination will be offered for those who wish credit.
The course to be offered is P. E. Number 409, Public Health and Social Hygiene, but we understand that it can be accepted for education and Social Science. The fee for either credit or audit is \$5.00.
The course will be of interest, not only to teachers, but to large numbers of people in other walks of life. Coos county is very fortunate indeed in being offered this excellent course under such capable leadership.
