## **Baking tips** for good eating ...

For rolls and coffee cakes 2 cups all-pur- 6 thaps, shorten-3 tsps. baking

Sift flour; measure; and sift again with baking powder and salt. Cut in shortening until it is as fine as corn meal. Break egg into measuring cup; beat with fork; and add enough milk to make 35 cup liquid. Add to flour mixture; stir with fork until all of flour is dampened. Turn out on lightly floured board.

This basic dough is suitable for almost every imaginable type of roll or coffee cake. For example:

Bake in moderately hot oven (425°F.) for about 15 minutes.


