C. of C. Asks More Time For Dairymen

(Continued from Page One) also spoke on the subject, said that the calf vaccination program is working satisfactorily and that a dairyman could build up a herd, free from Bang's disease, in three years. Because of the disease germs in the soil it is impossible to entirely wipe out the disease in the valley by the "test and slaughter" program.

After hearing all the remarks that could throw light on the subject, the board of directors ordered that a wire be sent to Coos county's senator and representatives in Salem asking that the proposed amendment to the law be so worded that it would essay time to clean their herds of the disease.

Secretary Hode Caughell read a letter at the meeting, from the Smaller War Plant Corporation officials that the meeting, suggested by Mr. Shawcross when he spoke here a few weeks ago, would be held in Coquille some time in February, the date to be announced later. The purpose of the meeting will be to get information needed to induce small plant operators to come to this section to make use of materials now going to waste here and also of the mineral resources of the county.

Another letter was from the State Highway Commission, promising attention to the need of repainting the yellow stripes in the center of the highways. The state has but two crews on that kind of a painting job where it formerly had three and, with the manpower shortage, it was feared there would be but one before long. Sec. H. B. Glazier said, however, that the highway department had it in mind and would send a crew here as soon as possible.

Another letter read was from J. A. Hannon, whose home was so badly damaged when that airplane wrecked so many buildings in the north part of Coquille last October 15. A letter from the Navy Department informed him that for damages under \$1000, the Navy could make settlement but for anything over that amount congressional action is necessary.

The chamber's president and secretary were instructed to write Oregon's congressional delegation in Washington asking that the reimbursement of the four persons here whose property suffered more than a damage of \$1,000 each be given prompt attention. It might be parenthetically added that the Navy has not yet reimbursed the 13 or 14 who suffered damages of less than \$1,000, for the catastrophe of four months ago.

President Evan Alborn informed the directors that he hoped to have copy for the Coquille brochure publicity ready to submit for their approval at the next meeting on Feb. 20. He also said that he was rather disappointed in the response to the request he made for pictures suitable to be shown in the booklet.
