Blood Plasma Is Not Being Sold

Navy. The administering of plasma, whole blood, and serum albumin is under the jurisdiction of the Armed Forces.

The Blood Donor Service is a project through which the American Red Cross procures blood for the armed forces at the request of the Army and Navy. It is the only agency through which the American people may volunteer their blood for the production of dried plasma and whole blood for American fighting men.

President Roosevelt in his recent announcement branding as "an unqualified falsehood" the "vicious rumor" that blood plasma is being sold, stated:

"From time to time I hear of new and ingenious ways the enemy is trying to hinder our war effort either by direct sabotage or indirect rumor mongering. The latest and most vicious rumor which has come to my attention is that blood plasma given so spontaneously and patriotically to the Red Cross by millions of Americans is being sold to our wounded fighting men. This is an unqualified falsehood. Persons spreading such rumors should be reported to the FBI."

National Red Cross Chairman Basil O'Connor, who categorically states, "these rumors are vicious lies and apparently circulated by persons who wish to deprive our fighting men of life saving plasma," continued:

"The blood which each week more than 100,000 patriotic Americans give to the Red Cross is turned over to the Army and Navy and processed by them into blood plasma, or flown as refrigerated whole blood to Europe and the Pacific. Full possession and control of the blood plasma passes into the hands of the Army and Navy when the Red Cross ships it from its centers to processing laboratories. The Army and Navy, as is well known, administer this blood or plasma to wounded soldiers and sailors without any charge."
