Recommendations To Victory Gardeners

Some victory gardeners have, no doubt, planted garden too early this year and will have to replant. Most of the early vegetable seeds should not be planted until the soil is warm and not too wet. When the soil, a few inches under the surface, is pressed into a ball, it should crumble easily or it is too wet. It is especially important in clay soil that the ground be worked at just the right time. Soil should be prepared so that the seed bed is firm. In other words, the soil must be worked up fine as deep as it is plowed or spaded. A seed bed with only the top two or three inches mulched and large clods and air spaces underneath will dry out early. It is important that plant roots have a loose, but compact soil to grow in.

The right depth to plant garden seeds is usually governed by the size of seed, the type of soil, and the amount of moisture in the soil. The same seed should be planted deeper on a light, sandy soil than on a heavy loam or clay soil. The depth to plant should be from four to eight times the diameter of the seed, depending on moisture and soil conditions. The soil should be firmly pressed over the seed rows. In home gardens where the soil is heavy clay, it is a good practice to cover rows of small seeds with sand or sandy soil. The sprouts sometimes have a hard time to force their way through the crust of heavy soil.

Seeds should be sown a little thicker than the plants will finally stand to allow for those that fail to grow or that may be killed when they are very young. Careful spacing of the correct amount of seeds at planting time will save much tedious thinning work. Thinning plants to the desired distances should be done early before they make much growth or become crowded. The largest and most vigorous plants should be left and the weaker plants removed. If thinning is delayed until the plants are large, the remaining plants will be relatively weak. Thinning should be done when the soil is moist so that the roots of the plants which are left to grow will be disturbed as little as possible.

Livestock Meeting Set For April 23

All livestock producers and dairymen are invited to attend a meeting which will be held in the Grange Hall in Myrtle Point starting at 10:00 a. m. on Monday, April 23, according to Martin G. Arnold, president of the County Livestock Association, which is sponsoring the meeting. The meeting will continue throughout the day with a potluck dinner being served at noon.

Consideration will be given to a number of subjects which are important to livestock producers and to dairymen who have cattle to market throughout the year. Land classification to provide for establishing grazing areas for range development will be outlined and a report will be given on plans which are under way by the association for marketing lambs and livestock during this year.

The group will discuss and make plans for holding a Lamb and Wool Show this year, according to action taken at the last meeting of the county association and practices which are available under the Agricultural Conservation Program in meet wartime production goals and encourage longtime soil conservation will be explained.

Harry Lindgren, Extension Animal Husbandman and Secretary of the Western Oregon Assn., is expected to be present and an invitation has been extended to R. C. Burkhardt, president of the Western Oregon Assn., to attend and participate in the discussion of matters which are important to producers in the western Oregon counties.
