Two new consolidated school districts were formed by votes cast in school districts on Monday, June 18, at the time of the annual school meetings.

These were formed by combination as follows: School district No. 41, Myrtle Point, and No. 24, Pleasant Point. Also school district No. 81, Laurel Lake, and No. 64, Four Mile.

According to the official count made on Monday by the Coos County District Boundary Board, the vote was unanimous, although light, and was as follows: Myrtle Point, 8 for; Pleasant Point 4 for. Laurel Lake, 7 for; Four Mile, 5 for.

The first consolidation is to be

designated as No. 41C, Myrtle Point Consolidated and the second as No. 81C, Four Mile Consolidated.
