Now to make a meal with tasty sandwiches

By using a filling of meat and/or vegetables between slices of bread a sandwich becomes a well-balanced plate that will satisfy the sharpest appetite. May we suggest by way of a delicious, out-of-the-ordinary dish:

- BAKED LUNCHEON SANDWICH**
2 slices bread 2 tbsp. shortening
1/2 lb. sliced American cheese 1 egg milk
1 tsp. prepared mustard 1/4 tsp. salt
2 slices, small space
- Toast bread. Place cheese slices on four slices of the toast and spread with mustard. Top with remaining toast and cut in halves lengthwise. Place in well greased square baking pan (8x8). Make white sauce: Melt shortening, blend in flour. Add milk gradually, stirring constantly. Cook until thickened, about 5 minutes. Add salt and chili sauce. Pour over cheese sandwiches. Bake in moderate oven (350° F) 15 minutes. Serve hot.
- SAUTED SUPPER SANDWICH**
Serve with green salad
- 1 cup ground boteloga 1/4 cup finely chopped celery
1/2 cup onion 1/2 cup mayonnaise
1/2 cup prepared mustard 12 slices bread
2 eggs 2 slices
1 hard cooked egg 1/4 tsp. salt
- Mix boteloga or ketchup, onion, mustard, lemon juice, chopped egg, celery and mayonnaise or salad dressing together. Spread generously between slices of bread; cut in half diagonally. Dip sandwiches in beaten egg mixed with milk and salt; saute in hot melted shortening or drippings. Serves 6.
