**Yamhill Officials Inspected Coos Tax System Monday**

R. P. Gill, Yamhill County Assessor; Miss Alice Schaeffer, deputy assessor, and Miss Nada Sitton, tax collector, spent Monday studying the new tax system installed in the assessor's office here by Chas. W. Forrest for Coos county. The system was installed under the supervision of Arthur A. Selander, chief appraisal engineer for the State Tax Commission and was completed for the 1943-44 fiscal year's taxes. Mr. Selander accompanied the group for the inspection and study and all were enthused and pleased with the simplicity, speed, and accuracy by which the tax roll is compiled.

The system was followed right through from start to finish and ended in the Tax Collector's office with an inspection of the tax statements in that that office which are made by the assessor under the new system and certified to the tax collector along with the tax roll. This phase of the inspection was of especial interest to Miss Nada Sitton, tax collector at McMinnville, who stated, "Receiving the tax statements already made out by the assessor would save the tax office in Yamhill county the time and expense of six girls' labor for two months writing the statements by hand." Miss Sitton felt that the congestion eliminated in that office together with receiving the tax statements absolutely correct from the assessor, would be well worth the time and expense of installing a new system in that county.

Mr. Gill, the assessor, could readily understand that a new system would entail considerable more work for the Assessor; however, he felt the system now in use in Yamhill county was antiquated, being an alphabetical assessment method, and should be replaced with a more accurate and controlled assessment system.

Mr. Forrest conducted the party on the tour of inspection which lasted for the entire day, considerable study being given to the more complicated phases of the work. Mr. Forrest states he has been informed by the Burroughs Tax Extending Machine representative, there are five counties installing identical systems as is now in use in Coos county.

The party returned to McMinnville Tuesday morning.
