The Sentinel Must Have Requests For Overseas Mailing

This is the joint order issued by the Post Office Department and the Navy Department:

"1. Individual copies of newspapers and magazines offered for mailing by publishers, addressed via the fleet post offices at New York or San Francisco, to Navy, Marine or Coast Guard personnel on duty overseas, shall be accepted only when they are being sent in fulfillment of written requests initiated by the addressees for subscriptions or renewals of subscriptions.

"2. Postmasters at the offices of mailing shall require publishers to present for their examination the requests from the addressees for subscriptions or renewals of subscriptions.

"3. Relatives and friends may pay for the subscriptions or renewals of subscriptions provided the addressees have initiated the requests therefor.

"4. Complimentary copies sent by publishers, copies paid for by advertisers, and copies sent under any kind of an agreement whereby the requests of the addressees are solicited shall not be accepted.

"5. Copies mailed in fulfillment of subscriptions which are unexpired on the effective date of this order shall be accepted until the subscriptions expire."

Two Sentenced, Paroled, One To Jail From Bay

The case of the State of Oregon against James W. Byars and Thos. Little, who were charged with defacing the building of another, over at the Bay, came up in circuit court here on Tuesday. They pleaded guilty and were sentenced by Judge King to 90 days in the county jail, but with an immediate parole on condition that within 30 days they pay the district attorney the value of the plate glass destroyed and conduct themselves as law-abiding citizens for one year during which they will be on probation.

Donald Fay Mills was brought to the county jail on Tuesday from Coos Bay to serve 27 1/2 days in jail. The sentence was imposed by Justice Allan Hall after Mills had been found guilty of taking and selling crabs without having secured a license to do so.

National Farm Safety Week To Be Observed July 22-28

National Farm Safety Week has been proclaimed by President Truman and will be observed throughout the nation from July 22 to 28.

The two-fold aim of the week, inaugurated last year by the National Safety Council as part of the nationwide accident prevention campaign, is (1) to educate farm dwellers to act safely 52 weeks of the year, and (2) to teach them to recognize, guard against and eliminate as many hazards as possible.

The need for such a week is underlined by the fact that on the average between 40 to 50 farm dwellers are killed by accidents each day, making an annual death toll of 15,000 to 17,000.

In view of the fact that more than 300 organizations and 50,000 individuals in 46 states took part in the observance of the first National Farm Safety Week, it is reasonable to assume that the activities of the week contributed to the reduction in the general accident toll in 1944.
